



The IEEE Sensors Council (SC) Nominations Committee requests nominations for qualified individuals to fill the SC officer positions listed below for the 2018-2019 term. Self-nominations are allowed. For each position we are looking for at least 2 candidates (to exceed the minimum 1.5 average¹ as per IEEE TAB rules). The positions are as required by the SC rules for odd year terms, as follows:

President Elect

Vice-President for Conferences (2-year term, renewable once)

Vice-President for Technical Activities (2-year term, renewable once)

(3) Member-at-Large (2-year term)

Here are some relevant texts from the SC Bylaws:

Section 7. "The AdCom shall elect the President-Elect, the Vice-President for Technical Operations, the Vice-President for Conferences, the Vice-President for Publications, and the Vice President for Finances from among nominees who have served the Sensors Council or one of its member societies, as a member of the administrative committee or board of governors, publications committee, editorial board, conferences/meetings committee or conference organizing committee."

*From Section 8: Eligibility for a particular office shall be restored after a lapse from that office of one year. **The President-elect, the Vice-President for Technical Operations, and the Vice-President for Conferences will be elected to begin their terms in even numbered years while the Vice-President for Finance and the Vice President for Publications will be elected to begin their terms in odd numbered years.***

The elections proper will take place during the Sensors Council AdCom meeting on March 19, 2017, in Atlanta, GA, USA.

The Nominations Committee requires the following information on each candidate:

1. Candidate Name (as it should appear on all election materials), Business Title/Position, Business Name, Business Address, Preferred Phone, Mobile Phone, Email address.

2. Candidate CV and a brief statement, not to exceed 350 words, on the candidate's prior achievements for the benefit of IEEE and IEEE Sensors Council. Explain the candidate's strengths and how those will help in the candidate's IEEE-SC leadership position.
3. Statement of Candidacy, not to exceed 300 words: Candidate's plans on using their office to strengthen the IEEE Sensors Council.
